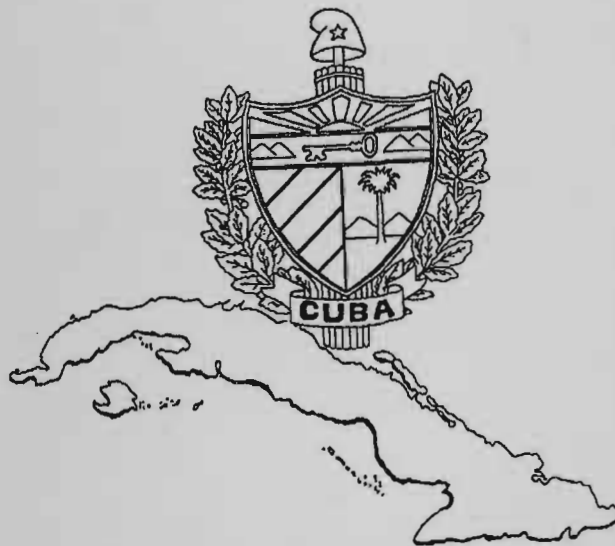

The Recabarren y Perez de Borroto

Don Martin de Recabarren y Perez e Borroto, Judge of the Royal Court of Chile, was born in the city of La Habana and married in Lima with Isabel Pardo de Figueroa y Lujan, originally from Tinta, Peru. They had, among others, a son named Estanislao de Recabarren y Pardo de Figueroa, Cannon of the Catholic Church, who was born in the capital of Chile.

Don Estanislao de Recabarren y Pardo de Figueroa, entered the Royal Order of Carlos III in 1797 (Archivo Nacional de Madrid, Ex. 1017).

The descendant of this gentleman, as we will expose here, have occupied very important government posts in the bast region of South American in the colonial period as well as in more recent times. The title of Count of Villeseñor was the honor of one of the sons of Martin de Recabarren; one of his daughters married the Marques of Cañada-Hermosa de San Bartolomé; another married the Marques of Encalada and one of his descendants married into de house of the Count ship of San Miguel de Carma; and the title of Count of Casa-Tagle de Trasierra also was given to one of the descendant of this Cuban.

After the independence of Chile, a member of the Recabarren family presided over the National Congress under the Constitution of 1828, and many years later another member of the family

was the Vice Admiral of the Armed Forces.

At the end of this study we also see that the principal lineage of the Recabarren from South America is again united to the Cuban branch of the lineage during the Ten Years War.

The Recabarren, who gave so many notable sons to Chile, -- where his descendant still occupy prominent political and social status--proceeded from Motrico, a Spanish village located in the northern province of Guipúzcoa, where they enjoyed the condition of Hijosdalgo.

The documented genealogy of this family begins as follows:

Don Miguel de Recabarren and his wife Maria Ibañez de la Torre Astigarribia, Hijosdalgos from the village of Motrico, were the parents of Maria, baptized in the year 1549; Francisca, baptized in 1555 and:

Martin Iñiguez de Recabarren, baptized in February 8, 1551. He was Regidor of the town in 1612 and Mayor in the years 1614, 1618 and 1621. He was also Mayordomor of the Parish church on 1615 and 1619. He married Maria Ruiz de Vidarza-bal and they has os offsprings:

Martin Ruiz de Recabarren was baptized in the parish of Motrico Octubre 31, 1580. He married Maria Esteban de Aguirre Iturriza and they had as children Pedro, who moved to Cuba, and:

Capitan Miguel de Recabarren y Aguirre, baptized in the same parish on February 2, 1609. He migrated to Cuba and became Mayor of the Municipality of Habana in 1644. He left testament with the scribe Francisco Hidalgo on May 7, 1655. His death entry is found on the Cathedral of La Habana, dated May 13,

1655 (L 2, F127, no. 3) and was interred in the convent of San Agustin. He married Leonor Marquez y Morta in the mentioned convent on July 5, 1640 and the entry was recorded in the Cathedral of La Habana, (L1, F267, no.2). This lady was baptized in the Cathedral of La Habana on May 26, 1627.(L2, F148, no. 7) where her death is also found dated May 17, 1666, (L2, F160, no. 3). She was the daughter of Captain Damian Marquez and Ana de Morta y Maestre. who were married on November 2, 1622 in the same Cathedral.

From the marriage of Captain Miguel de Recabarren and Leonor Marquez were born: Damian, Miguel, Ana, Beatriz, Juan, martin and Pedro de Recabarren y Marquez de Morta, of which:

1.Damian de Recabarren y Marquez de Morta, born in Habana, was presbyter, and left his testament before the scribe Antonio Sanchez and named as his heirs his brother Miguel and Micaela de Urbina, wife of Felipe de Morta, his cousin. The death entry of Damian in the Cathedral of La Habana dated October 7, 1673 (L2, F243, No.3).

2. Miguel de Recabarren y Marquez de Morta will be discussed latter.

3. Ana de Recabarren y Marquez de Morta was baptized ion the Cathedral of Habana the first of July, 1646 (L3, F285, No. 3).

4. Beatriz de Recabarren y Marquez de Morta was baptized in the same Cathedral on March 31, 1653 (L4, F5, No. 1).

5. Juan de Recabarren y Marquez de Morta, born on July 4, 1651, and baptized in the same Cathedral on Julio 8, 1651 (L4,

F35, No. 3)

6. Martin de Recabarren y Marquez de Morta, baptized on March 31, 1653 (L4, F69, No. 2)

7. Pedro de Recabarren y Marquez de Morta, baptized in the same Cathedral on November 4, 1655, (L4 F118, No, 3), and his godfather was si paternal uncle Pedro de Recabarren y Aguirre.

Miguel de Recabarren y Marquez de Morta, already mentioned above as number two, was baptized in the Cathedral of La Habana on November 15, 1655 (L3, F257, No. 2), being his godfather Diego de Egues, Knight of the Order of Santiago. The first of January of 1696 he was elected Regidor of the City of La Habana. In 1719 he sent a petition to the Council fo the Indies asking to prohibit the cutting of wood in a site owned by him. (Volume II, Registration no. 174, page 56, Catalogue of Cuban Sources of the General Archive of the Indies). He made his last will and testament before the scribe Tomas Nuñez the 9th of Julio 1734 and died at the age of 93; his death entry is found on the Cathedral of La Habana dated April 9, 1737 (L6, F52, no. 8), and was interred in the chapel of the Third Order of San Francisco where he was a member.

He married in the same Cathedral on September 20, 1670 (L3, F44, No. 3) with Lucia Perez de Borroto y Chirinos, who in turn was baptized on the same Cathedral on June 25, 1641 (L3, F180, no. 3). She gave Power of Attorney to her husband before the scribe Juan de Argote, on September 14, 1696 and we find her death entry at the Cathedral dated September 15, 1696 (L3, F242, No. 63). This lady was the daughter of Diego Perez Borroto-Costilla y Balmaceda and Maria Magdalena Chirino y Velazquez de Cuellar. Diego Perez Borroto-Costilla

was baptized on October 10, 1601 (L2, F11, No. 6); left his testament before scribe Francisco Hidalgo and his death entry is found in the same Cathedral dated September 24, 1653 (L2, F115, No. 3). Maria Magdalena Chirinos was baptized in the Cathedral on October 18, 1600 L2, D8, No. 11). She was always know by the surname Chirino y Roxas-Inestrosa. She left her testament with the scribe Juan de Argote on February 14, 1682. Her death entry is found in the Cathedral dated February 4, 1619, (L3, F81, No. 3). This couple married on February 4, 1619 (L1, F159, No. 461).

Going back go Miguel de Recabarren, from the mentioned marriage to Lucia Perez de Borroto they had the following children: Leonor, Miguel Aniceto, Diego Jose, Magdalena Gertrudis, Maria (known as Maria de la Candelaria), Martin, and Josefa de Recabarren y Perez de Borroto. Of which:

1. Leonor de Recabarren y Perez de Borroto was born on March 30, 1672 and was baptized in the Cathedral of La Habana on April 11, 1672 (L5, F220, No. 3). She died single.

2. Miguel-Aniceto de Recabarren y Perez de Borroto was born on April 17, 1673 and was baptized in the Cathedral of La Habana on May 3, 1673 (L5, F246, No. 1). He died at 8 years of age and his death entry in dated August 10, 1682 (L3, F29, No. 3).

3. Diego Jose de Recabarren y Perez de Borroto, was born on November 3, 1674 and was baptized in the Cathedral of La Habana on the 19 of that month, (L6, F17, No. 2). He died a single man.

4. Magdalena Gertrudis de Recabarren y Perez de Borroto was born on October 29, 1675 and was baptized in the Cathedral of

La Habana on November 17, 1675)16, F35, no. 2). She entered the convent of Santa Clara on September 9, 1694 and used the name of Sor Magdalena Gertrudis del Carmen.

5. Maria de Recabarren y Perez de Borroto was born on February 10, 1678 and baptized in the Cathedral of La Habana on March 8, 1678 (L8, F80, No. 1). She was know as Maria de la Candelaria de Recaberran, and left testament with her husband on April 15, 1752 before the scribe of Guanabacoa Nicolas Flores Rubio. Her death entry is found in the Cathedral of La Habana dated August 25, 1753 (L7, F160, No.155). Maria married in the Cathedral of La Habana on November 24, 1717 (L4, F48, no. 24) with Ignacio Francisco de Barrutia y Aeta-Echeganucia, originally from the village of Vergara, in Guipúaco, dioceses of Vitoria. He was the Captain General of Calvary of La Habana and then in Mexico City; Captain General and Governor of New Vizcaya in the year 1728 and Knight of the Order of Santiago which he entered on March 18, 1719. This gentleman, when a prisoner on El Morro of La Habana, disputed with the Governor for the treatment as Knight that was owned him, in the year 1738. He was the son of Ignacio de Barrutia y Beistegui and Francisca Josefa de Aeta Echeganucia.

6. Martin de Recabarren y Perez de Borroto, a lawyer, will be discussed later.

7. Josefa de Recabarren y Perez de Borroto was born on February 27, 1680 and was baptized in the Cathedral of La Habana on March 10, 1680 (L6, F138, no.3).

The lawyer Martin de Recabarren y Perez de Borroto, already mentioned above as number six, was born in la Habana on November 11, 1679, and was baptized on December 1, 1679 (L6, F120, no. 1). He studied in Mexico City, and received the

law degree from the University of Mexico. He was Judge of the Royal Courts of Panama in 1712; was transferred to the one in Santiago de Chile in 1716 as interim judge and was called permanently in 1723. He occupied that post until 1767. He left testament in Santiago de Chile with the scribe Juan Bautista de Borda, and died in that city in 1767. He married by power of attorney in Cuzco, Peru in the year 1725 with Isabel Pardo de Figueroa y Lujan-Sigoney. This lady was baptized in the parish of Tinta, Cuzco, on October 28, 1700, and left her testament with the scribe Juan Bautista de Borda. She was the daughter of Bernardo Pardo de Figueroa y Sotomayor and Margarita de Lujan-Sigoney y Vazquez de Acuña.

Martin de Recabarren fathered a son out of wedlock who was named Manuel Jose and lived in Arequipa in 1765.

Martin de Recabarren and his wife Isabel Pardo de Figueroa were that parents of Miguel, Jose, Martin Tomas, Lucia, Petronila, Estanislao, Francisca Xaviera, Francisco de Paula, Juana, y Margarita de Recabarren y Pardo de Figueroa. Of which:

1. The doctor Miguel de Recabarren y Pardo de Figueroa, born in Santiago de Chile February of 1726, died in Spain. He studied in the convent of San Francisco Xavier in his city of birth and then in Lima in the school of San Martin. He received his doctorate in Cannon Law from the University of Lima.

2. Jose de Recabarren y Pardo de Figueroa, was born in Santiago de Chile, on March 25, 1728. He was a Colonel of the Royal Army and in 1791 became Mayor of the municipality of La Serena. He also became the V Count of Villaseñor from February 16, 1781, dying in his native city on May 26, 1812. He married Tadea Gayon de Celis y Ureta (daughter of Toribio

Gayon de Celis and Petronila de Ureta y Carrera) in La Serena and they were the parents of Jose, who did not have any children from his marriage to Maria Engracia Elso; Manuel, who was a student of Colegio Carolino in 1778; Isabel Antonia, who married Luis Varas Marin ; Felipa, who married Ignacio Varas; and Petronila de Recabarren y Gayon de Celis, who married Jose Antonio Guzman y Palacios, the son of Juan Francisco Guzman and Rosa Palacios.

3. Martin Tomas de Recabarren y Pardo de Figueroa was born in Santiago de Chile on March 7, 1729, and was baptized in the cathedral of that city the following October. He was a distinguished Jesuit, who resided in Imola, Italy after being sent into exile. He died in Spain in 1823 in the school fo Jesuit in Murcia.

4. Lucia de Recabarren y pardo de Figueroa was a nun on the monastery of the Order of Our Lady of Carmen in San Jose.

5. Petronila de Recabarren y Pardo de Figueroa died as an infant.

6. Doctor Estanislao de Recabarren y Pardo de Figueroa was born in Santiago de Chile on November 6, 1738, and was baptized in the cathedral on the 16th of that month and year. This distinguished priest was educated in the convent of San Francisco Xavier, where he studied philosophy and theology, and received his doctorate in Sacred Theology and Cannon Law from the University of San Felipe. He was the Treasurer of the Metropolitan Santiago and in 1770 was Dean of the Cathedral of that City. In 1776 he became Vice Rector of the University of San Felipe, and the following year became Rector, being reelected as such in 1778; he was also Senior member of that center from December 7, 1804 to his death. In 1797 after the

proof of this notorious hildago lineage, he was given the Royal and Distinguished Cross of the Order of Carlos III.

7. Sor Francisca Xaviera de Recabarren y Pardo de Figueroa, was a nun of the convent of Nra. Sra. del Carmen in San Jose.

8. Francisco de Paula de Recabarren y Pardo de Figueroa, will be treated later.

9. Juana de Recabarren y Pardo de Figueroa, married in Santiago de Chile with Ignacio Marin de Poveda y Asua, son of Jose Valentin Lopez Marin y Gonzalez de Poveda, Second Marquis of Cañada Hermosa de San Bartolome and his wife Ana Maria Ruiz de Asua e Iturgoyen.

10. Margarita de Recabarren y Pardo de Figueroa was baptized in the Cathedral of Santiago de Chile on July 14, 1727. She married in the same cathedral on June 19, 1751 with Manuel Diego Calvo de Encalada y Chacon, who was also born in that city and was baptized in the same cathedral in August 9, 1719. He was the second Marquis of Villa Palma de Encalada, Captain of the Royal Army, and rich encomendero of San Francisco de Codao; Mayor of the city of Santiago de Chile, and was Knight of the Order of Calatrava since 1728. He was the son of Diego Calvo de Encalada y Orozco, First Marquis of Villa Palma, who was baptized in Sevilla's parish of San Juan de la Palma in August 30, 1673 and his wife Catalina Josefa Chacon y Carvajal, also baptized in the same cathedral on April 21, 1700.

From the marriage of Manuel Diego Calvo de Encalada and Margarita Recabarren were born the following: Jose Manuel Antonio Maria Bautista, Martin, Maria de las Mercedes, Miguel (who died as an infant), Maria Josefa, Maria Teresa, and Maria Antonio Calvo de Encalada y Recabarren. Of which:

A. Jose Manuel Antonio Maria Bautista Calvo de Encalada y Recabarren was born in Santiago de Chile on June 3, 1752 and was baptized in the Cathedral of that city on the 7th of the month. He was Captain of the Cavalry of the Princess in his native city and entered the Knighthood of the Order of Santiago on July 8, 1784. He was the Third Marquis of Villa Palma de Encalada from May 29, 1797 and in 1810 he was given the post of Governor of Valparaiso, but he did not serve the post. He died in Madrid on April 9, 1821, where he married on May 4, 1803 to Maria Luisa Rodriguez de Valcarcel y Jimenez, daughter of Alonso Rodriguez de Valcarcel, Lieutenant of the Regiment of Soria.

B. Martin Calvo de Encalada y Recabarren, was born in Santiago de Chile on January 17, 1756 and was baptized in the Cathedral of that city, where his death entry is also found dated July 2, 1828. He entered the Order of Santiago on September 9, 1793, after providing the required paper work. He was Lieutenant on the Regiment of the Princess and Mayor of the city Santiago de Chile in 1786. He supervised the construction of the canal Maipo and was Administrator of the Hospital San Francisco de Borja, posts that he served in the colonial period. After the independence was Senator in the National Congress in 1811 and Vice-president of the Second Government Junta, Auxiliary Mayor for Santiago de Chile in 1813 and Chief of Police.

C. Maria de las Mercedes Calvo de Encalada y Recabarren was born in Santiago de Chile, and married in the Cathedral of that city in Augusto 7, 1779 to Lorenzo Blanco y Ciceron, born in San Julian de Marin in 1748. He was a lawyer, Attorney General of the Royal Court of Chile and later Judge of the Courts of Cuenos Aires and Charcas. He died in the city of La Plata in 1790. He was the son of Jose Blanco y Salgado and

Rosa Ciceron. From the marriage of Lorenzo Blanco and Maria de las Mercedes Calvo de Encalada were born Buenventura, born in Buenos Aires on July 14, 1782; and Manuel Blanco y Calvo de Encalada, born in La Plata, on 1792. He was a notorious insurgent that commandeered the surprise attack to Cancha Rayada and was an illustrious Admiral in the Army of Chile.

D. Maria Josefa Calvo de Encalada y Racabarren was born in Santiago de Chile on 1753, and married in that Cathedral of that city on November 20, 1775 with Ambrosio Cerdan de Landa, Attorney General of the Courts of Santiago de Chile and Regent of Guatemala. He was the son of Dionisio Cerdan de Landa, from Cuenca, and Maria Antonio de Simon Pontero, from Teruel.

This couple were the parents of Dionisio Cerdan de Landa y Calvo de Encalada, born in the city of Los Reyes in 1780, who entered as a cadet in the Royal Army on November 5, 1795.

E. Maria Teresa Calvo de Encalada y Recabarren, born in Santiago de Chile, married in the city's cathedral to Jose de Gorbea y Vadillo, a lawyer, Judge of the Court of Chile and Attorney General of Lima.

F. Maria Antonio Calvo de Ancalada y Recabarren, was born in Santiago de Chile and died there on April 17, 1826, after leaving her last will and testament with Scribe Agustin Diaz. She married in the Cathedral with Fernando Marquez de la Plata y Orozco. He was an illustrious lawyer, protector of the Indians in La Plata during 1776. They were the parents of Manuel; Rafael (married to Maria del Carmen Valdes y Lecaroz) and

Fernando Marquez de la Plata y Calvo de Encalda, baptized in the Cathedral of Santiago de Chile, and was an notable insur-

gent who emigrated from 1814 to 1817 and returned as Sargent Mayor I 1823. His death entry is found in the mentioned cathedral dated July 29, 1863. He married there on August 3, 1814 with Maria del Carmen de Guzman y Fontecilla. From this marriage were born Fernando, Elias (married to Maria del Carmen del Solar y Cañas), Rafael, Miguel, Maria de las Mercedes (married to Vicente Garcia-Huidobro y Aldunate), Maria del Carmen (married to Domingo Santa Maria) and Emilia Marque de la Plata y Guzman. Of which:

Fernando Marquez de la Plata y Guzman married Rosa del Solar y Cañas, and their offsprings were Fernando, Maria del Carmen, Enrique, Alberto, Rosa and Florencio Maruquez de la Plata y del Solar, who died in Santiago de Chile on March 18, 1922 and married there on September 20, 1854 with Rosa de Echenique y Tagle, who was born on July 26, 1864 and was the Countess of Casa-Tagle de Trasierra from June 18, 1919. This married procreated Fernando Marquez de la Plata y Echenique, born in Santiago de Chile on February 2, 1896. He was a distinguished diplomat of his country and Third Count Casa-Tagle de Trasierra since June 19, 1935. He married in parish on May 10, 1924 with Maria Rosa Gonzalez de Andia-Irarrazabel y Fernandez de Muras, born in Santiago de Chile on February 1, 1901, the daughter of Fernando Gonzalez de Andia-Irarrazabal and Maria de las Mercedes Fernandez de Muras. He was Fourth Marque of Pica.

Francoisco de Paula de Recabarren y Pardo de Figueroa, son of the illustrious Cuban Martin de Recabarren y Perez de Borroto, Marques de Morta y Chirinos, and Isabel Pardo de Figueroa, was born in Santiago de Chile on February 14, 1740. He lived in La Serena, Chile, where he was a rich landlord, Coronel of the Militia and Mayor of the city on 1774 and 1782. He married in la Serena with Josefa de Aguirre y Roxas, also

known as Josefa Aguirre y Argodaña, the daughter of Ignacio de Aguirre y Fuica and Bartolina de Roxas y Argandofia. From this marriage were born Francisco de Paula Jose; Luisa; Rafaela' and Coronel Manuel Antonio de Recabarren y Aguirre. Of which:

1. Luisa de Recabarren y Aguirre, born in La Serena, died in Santiago de Chile on May 31, 1839. She married in the Cathedral of Chile on July 25, 1797 with Jose Gaspar Marin y Esquivel, Secretary of the first National Junta. From this marriage were born Maria de las Mercedes (married with Enrique del Solar), Buenaventura (distinguished philosopher), Estanislao (professor of the National Institute of Santiago de Chile) Francisco (who belonged to the National Congress of Chile), and Francisca Marin y Recabarren, who was married to Francisco Xavier Varas y Recabarren and they were the parents of Pio Varas y Marin.

2. El Coronel Manuel Antonio de Recabarren y Aguirre, born in La Serena and distinguished independentist who sign the Constitution of Chile in 1828. He was also Deputy of Coquimbo in 1811, Senator in the Republic, and Vice-president of the Appealate Court in Santiago de Chile. He married in Santiago with Martina Rencoret y Cienfuegos (niece of Jose Ignacio Cienfuegos) and they procreated Manuel, and the mother of Enrique Foster y Recabarren. The descendancy of Miguel Antonio de Recaberren y Aguirre is represented in the lineages of Vial, Matta-Vial, Gatica, Cortes, Foster, Donoso, Vergara, Besa, Reyes Subercaseaux I Irarrazabal, but we were not able to list the for lack of data.

3. Rafaela de Recabarren y Aguirre, born in La Serena, married on December 19, 1804 to Jose Joaquin de Echavarria y Larrain, son of Diego Perfecto de Echavarria y Aragon and Monica

Josefa de Larrain y Lecaroz. From this marriage were born Diego and Maria de Echavarria y Recabarren. Of which:

A. Diego de Echevarria y Recabarren, married Rita de Larrain y Fernandez de Gandarillas, daughter of Juan Francisco de Larrain y Rixas-Gamboa and Maria de las Mercedes Fernandez de Gandarillas y Aranguiz.

B. Maria de Echevarria y Recabarren was the first wife of Joaquin de Larrain y Roxas-Gamboa, son of Francisco de Larain y Lecaroz and Agustina de Roxas-Gamboa. They were the parents of Rosalia de Larrain y Echevarria, who married Francisco de Figueroa y Araoz.

Francisco de Paula Jose de Recabarren y Aguirre, already mentioned as son of Francisco de Paula de Recabarren and Josefa de Aguirre y Roxas, was born in La Serena on December 3, 1772. He was Interim Governor of Cochabamba, Santa Cruz de la Sierra and Huamanga and died on January 24, 1820. He married in Santiago de Chile on April 29, 1796 with Constanza Cortes de Madariage y Asua, the daughter of Ramon Cortes y Madariaga and Francisca de Paula de Asua y Marin de Poveda. From this marriage was born

Francisca de Paula de Recabarren y Cortes de Madariaga, was born in Santiago de Chile on April 4, 1798, were she died on November 28, 1873. She married in the parish of Huamanga with Jose Gabriel de Herboso y Larreategui, Count of San Miguel de Carma, Governor of Huamanga and Tarma, Coronel of Infantry of the Royal Army, Knight of the Order of Isabel la Catolica. He was he son of Domingo Pedro de Herboso y Asotraica, and Manuela de Larreategui y Perez de Montoya. They were the parents of:

Guillermo de Herboso y Recabarren, born in Huamanga on March 22, 1822, who was a lawyer and Secretary of the Delegation of Bolivia in Spain. He married in Madrid on August 15, 1849 with Manuela de España y Ochoteco, originally from Cadiz, and who died in Quillota, Chile on May 27, 1871. They were the parents of Constanza, Fernando and Francisco Jose de Herboso y España. Of which:

1. Constanza de Herboso y España, will be treated later.
2. Fernando de Herboso y España, born in Quillota, on October 18, 1855, was engineer, graduated from the University of Santiago de Chile and Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. He died single on October 4, 1892 in Santiago de Chile.
3. Francisco Jose de Herboso y España was born in Quillota, on March 24, 1861. He was a lawyer and Deputy of the National Congress of Chile. He married on August 15, 1885 with Maria Correa y Sanfuentes.

Constanza de Herboso y España married the Cuban citizen Anibal de Agüero y Betancourt, originally from the city of Puerto Principe, now Camagüey. This gentleman, being a minor, was part of an expedition of the Cuban rebels in the Ten Year War, who was lead by his brother Alberto de Agüero. They were imprisoned in 1869 and Alberto was deported to Ceuta. Anibal was set free due to his age and he established himself in Chile. His parents were Fernando de Agüero y Varona and Angela Betancourt y Gonzalez, both member of distinguished families of Puerto Principe. Anibal de Agüero and Constanza de Herboso were the parents of Angela de Agüero y Herboso, born in Chile and married to Jorge Saavedra y Rivera, born in Chile and they were the parents of Jorge and Fernando Saavedra y Agüero.

Jorge Saavera y Agüero was a distinguished diplomat and Secretary of the Chilean Embassy in Argentina and Brazil.
